NORWICH PHIL SPREADS ITS WINGS

The closure for refurbishment in 2024 of The Halls – the Phil's home venue – initially proved a challenge. However, we recast it as an opportunity: to spread our wings, to visit new venues, to win new audiences, and to reshape our season in an exciting new direction.

Our major choral concert, which usually closes the season, has been brought forward to make use of the space of The Halls. The Kingdom, the third of the great triptych of Elgar oratorios, promises to get the season off to a spectacular and memorable start on 4 November. A guartet of top soloists, including a special surprise guest soprano, join the orchestra and chorus in this rarely performed masterpiece.

The orchestral concert on 9 December welcomes back leading British pianist, Martin Roscoe, to play the Variations on a Nursery Song by Dohnanyi. Tchaikovsky's Fourth Symphony and Rimsky-Korsakov's suite The Snow Maiden complete the programme.

The ever-popular Family Christmas Concert on 19 December will be our last performance at The Halls for at least a year, so book early to be sure of your seat for this landmark occasion.

Our first new venture of the season is on 10 February, when the orchestra decamps to the well-appointed and comfortable King's Centre on King Street for a special Children's Concert. The programme, based around the theme of knights and heroes, is designed to appeal to young children, who can sit on bean bags at the front to be near the players. There will be two performances, each of around 50 mins plus a short interval, during which the youngsters will be able to have a go on a variety of instruments.

The final choral concert on 9 March pairs Mozart's passionate Requiem with Beethoven's powerful Fifth Symphony and has been specially chosen to complement the glorious setting of Norwich Cathedral. The performance marks David Dunnett's farewell as the Phil's Chorus Conductor and promises to be a fitting send-off, not to mention a very hot ticket.

The orchestra closes the season with a return to the spacious Showground Arena on 20 April for a night at the movies. Our sparkling programme of classic and popular film music features some of the greatest hits in cinema - including music from the Bond movies and by John Williams, as well as classic scores by Elmer Bernstein (The Magnificent Seven), Erich Korngold (The Sea Hawk) and Bernard Hermann (North by North West).


