An Amazing 2015-16 Phil 175th Anniversary Season

For anyone who hasn't yet heard, next season the Norwich Philharmonic Society will be 175 years old. To celebrate this remarkable landmark we have a very special season lined up with some real box office favourites like **Beethoven's Emperor Concerto** (with the wonderful **Mihkel Poll** returning as soloist), **Dukas' Sorcerer's Apprentice** and a whole programme of classical pops for our 175th Birthday Concert in March, including the rarely done choral version of **Tchaikovsky's 1812 Overture** - complete with cannon and mortar effects! We also thought it fitting to feature some major British works in our anniversary season: our opening concert will be a performance of **The Dream of Gerontius by Elgar**, a much-loved favourite of Norwich performers and audiences alike, and the orchestra perform **Vaughan Williams' Norfolk Rhapsody** and **William Walton's thrilling First Symphony**. Adding some French colour we have ballet music from **Poulenc's Les Biches** and Alison Roddy is the vocalist in the delightful **Songs of the Auvergne by Canteloube** while **Rachmaninov's Symphonic Dances** will show off the orchestra to dazzling effect. And to cap it all we are planning to present a spectacular performance of **Mahler's 8th Symphony**, **'The Symphony of a Thousand'**, as part of the Norfolk & Norwich Festival in May – see below. There is still some work to be done before this can be confirmed, but fingers crossed...what a season!



Mahler Symphony No. 8 (Symphony of a Thousand)

As part of our 175th Anniversary season, we are planning to do an extra concert on **21 May 2016** of Mahler's gigantic 8th Symphony. Rarely performed because of the huge resources needed (very large orchestra and off-stage band, organ, two choirs, a children's choir and 8 soloists), the concert would take place at the Norfolk Showground Arena and, as well as the Phil Orchestra and Choir, it will also feature the Festival Choir, UEA Choir, Sheringham and Cromer Choral Society, Kings Lynn Festival Chorus, Norwich Cathedral Choir and the Academy of St Thomas.



This ambitious project will call for extensive preparation and rehearsal through the course of the season as well prior to the performance itself - more details to follow. There is still a way to go before we can say we have the necessary funding in place, so the project is still provisional at this stage. But to perform it is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity so be sure to keep the date free in your diary!!

St Andrews Hall forecourt parking



The number of cars we are allowed to park on the forecourt of St Andrews Hall for rehearsals and concerts is restricted to prevent vehicles blocking one another, and ensure access for emergency vehicles. We are allocated 6 permits, and **you are not**

allowed to park unless you display a permit. In addition, blue badge holders are also allowed to park at the Hall's discretion. It's advisable to contact the Halls in advance to make arrangements on 01603 628477.
