Orchestra back in action



Although we all stopped making music when the virus struck in March, the Phil Committee has kept meeting on a regular basis ever since to review developments and work out when it would be safe to get together and play again. And finally, after months of lockdown and no music making, it felt so good to get together in October and play music as an orchestra again.

We were lucky to be given special access to the vast space of the Showground Arena where we could safely assemble a full, socially-

distanced symphony orchestra and experience the joy of playing through Tchaikovsky's 5th Symphony. We just managed to fit in our final play-through – with a small but appreciative audience from the choir – before lockdown v2 came along and we had to stop meeting.

But the good news is that with this current lockdown coming to an end on 2nd December we are able to get back to playing together again and we have dates booked at the Showground for **Monday 7th** (note change of day!) and **Tuesday 15th December.** On the 7th we will play through Dvorak's 7th Symphony - in a special edition which Matt has found with newly discovered passages that none of us has played before. Then on Tuesday 15th we will have a fun night of festive music – to which our percussion players are warmly invited to come along!

And any of our string players who haven't previously signed up who would now like to join us for these last two sessions before Christmas are most welcome to come along too. We would just ask you to let us know so that we can send you your part for the Dvorak and a Test & Trace form to complete.

The plan is then to resume playing at the Showground from Tuesday 5th January through to March but we will let you have more information about that and the repertoire planned in due course.
